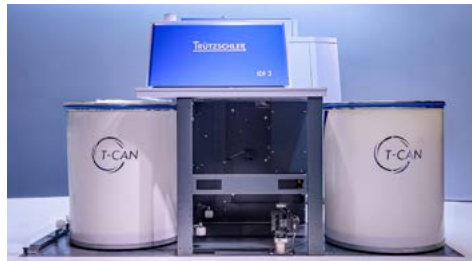

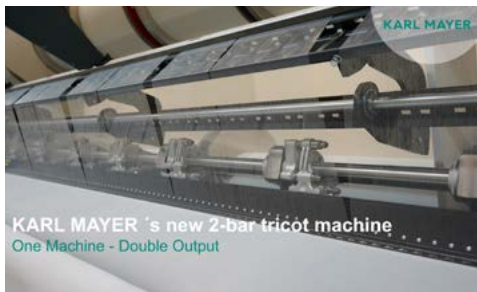

## Knitting (Hall 5)

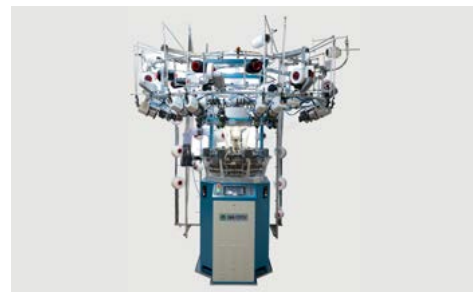

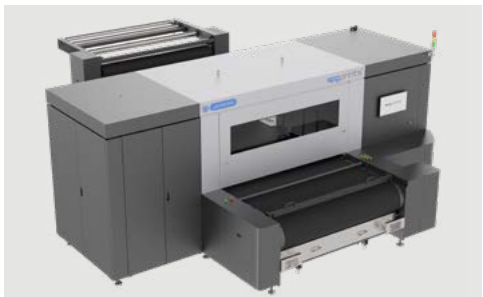

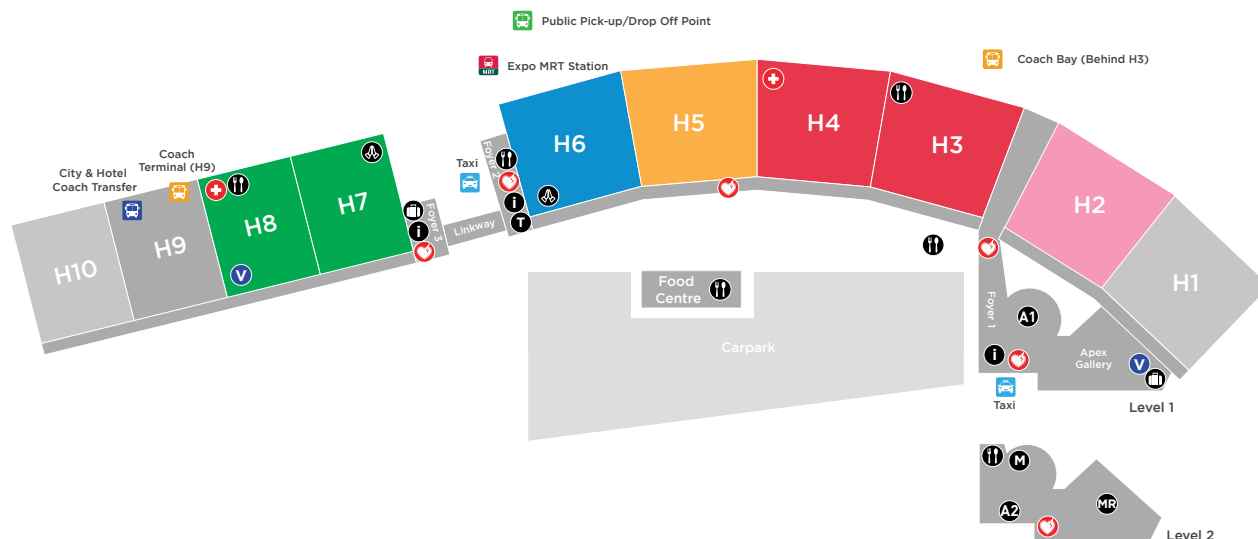

Short-term travellers holding a passport or travel document from a country requiring a visa must apply for one before entering Singapore.

- Apply early:** Submit your visa application 30 days before your intended date of arrival.
- Letter of Invitation:** You may request for a Letter of Invitation when registering for your badge. Once your registration is successfully completed, the visa letter will be sent to you (if requested).
- Additional requirement:** For some countries, the submissions of Form 39A is required.
